Sermon Text: Song Of Solomon 4:5

Her Breasts—Young Roes

Song of Solomon 4:5 Thy two breasts are like two young roes that are twins, which feed among the lilies.

In the opening verses of chapter four of Song Of Solomon, the Bridegroom is praising the flawless beauty of his Bride. So far he has praised:

1—her eyes

2—her hair

3—her teeth


4—her lips

5—her temples

6—her neck

And now, he concludes by praising her ***two breasts***, which he compares to ***two young roes that are twins, which feed among the lilies.***

We'll pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and do so some word study on this verse. We'll begin by considering what we already know.



This is not the first time the idea of *feeding among the lilies* is used in the Song of Songs. In 2:16 we read: ***“My beloved is mine, and I am his: he feedeth among the lilies.”***

The lilies refer to his own people. ***Song of Solomon 2:2 “As the lily among thorns, so is my love among the daughters.”***

Truth: Christ dwells among his people in his Word. Compare:

John 1:1 ***In the beginning was the Word***, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. **John 1:14** ***“And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us,*** (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.”

This will get us started.
