**Song of Solomon 5:12 His eyes are as the eyes of doves by the rivers of waters, washed with milk, and fitly set.**


We have all heard the saying—“Beauty is in the eye of the beholder.” This is particularly true when the subject is the eyes of God. There are two sides to this coin.

For the children of the Devil, the eyes of God are nothing less than terrifying. In Revelation 1:14 the Spirit says of the Son of God—**“His eyes were as a flame of fire.”** And the same Holy Spirit tells us—**“The eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good.”** Proverbs 15:3. All of their wicked deeds, many of

which were done in the secret of darkness, are seen and known by the almighty God. And Judgement Day is swift approaching.

For the children of God, these very same eyes of the Son of God are beautiful beyond description. And the Holy Spirit reveals so many comforting truths about them.

One Example: ***“For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth; to shew himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him!”*** II Chronicles 16:9.
